Industrial Visit Report Visit to Elcom International Pvt. Ltd., MIDC, Kolhapur

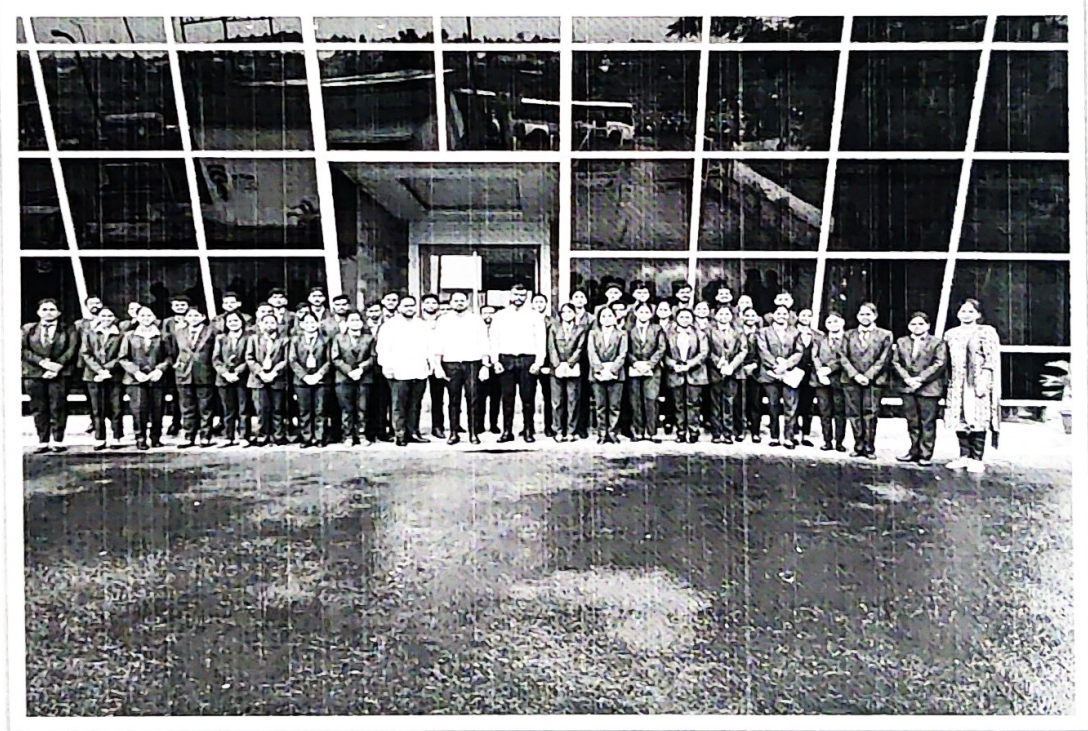
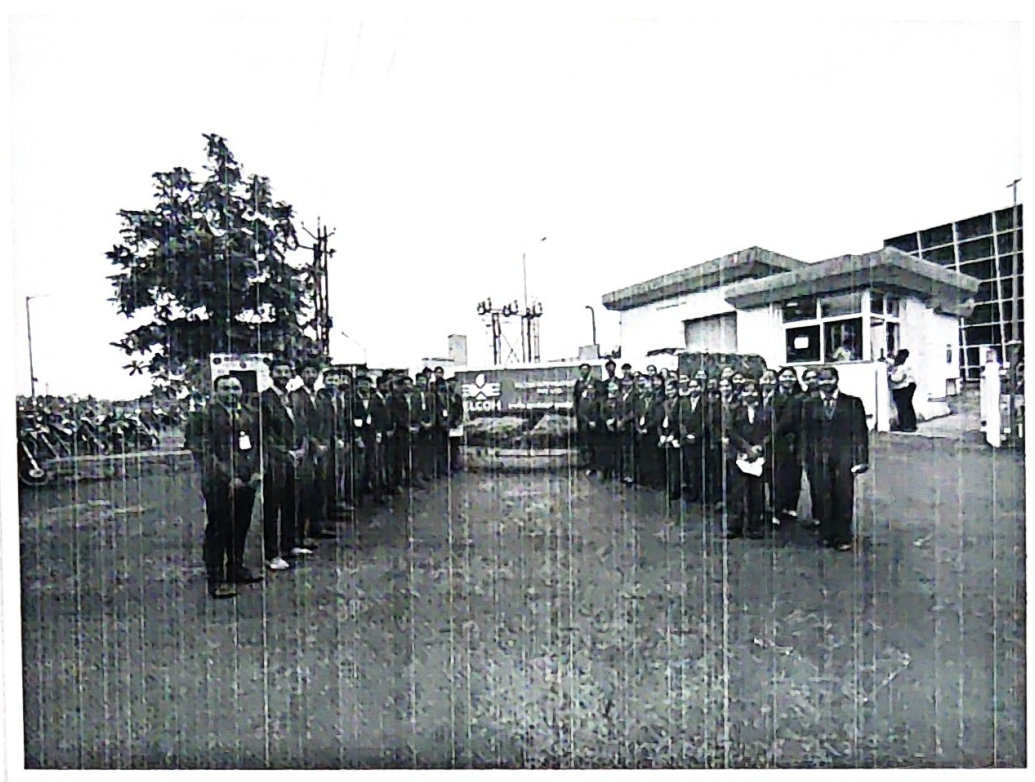
Date: 4th October 2025

As part of the MBA academic program, an industrial visit was organized to Elcom International Pvt. Ltd., a reputed manufacturing and engineering company located in MIDC, Kolhapur, on 4th October 2025. The visit aimed to provide students from various specializations—Marketing, Finance, Human Resource, Operations, and IT—with practical exposure to real industrial and managerial practices. A total of 43 MBA students accompanied by 2 faculty members participated in this educational visit. Elcom International Pvt. Ltd. is known for its excellence in manufacturing electrical and electronic components with a strong focus on innovation, quality, and operational efficiency. The visit was planned to help students learn the managerial skills required for different job specifications and to observe how management principles are implemented across various departments within the organization.

The main objectives of the industrial visit were to understand the practical application of management concepts, identify managerial competencies required for various job roles, and bridge the gap between classroom learning and industry practices. It also aimed to encourage teamwork, leadership, and professional behavior among students by providing exposure to a real corporate environment.
