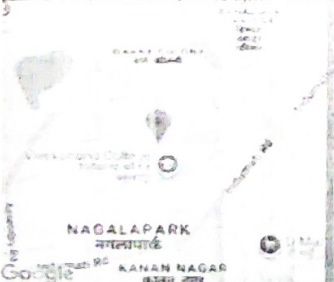
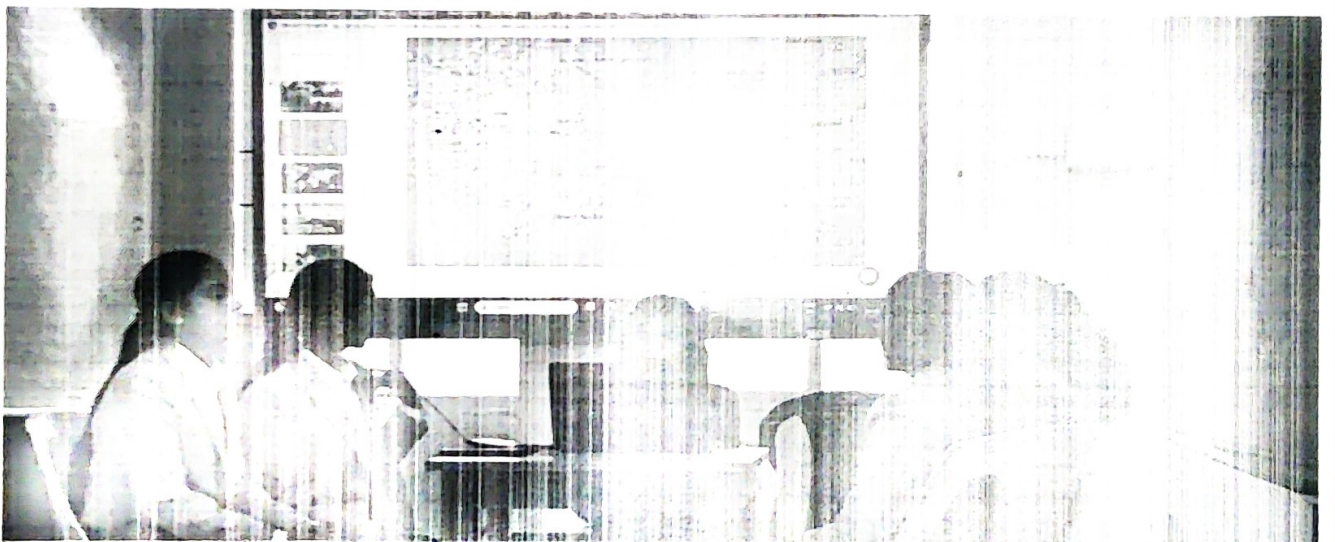
Report on the "Global Conflict and Business Resilience" Role Play Activity

Date: 11th March 2026

On March 11, 2026, the Department of Management Studies conducted an intensive and highly interactive Role Play Activity for the MBA First Year students, titled "Global Conflict and Business Resilience." This academic exercise was specifically designed to help students analyze the real-time economic consequences of the escalating Iran-Israel conflict and its cascading effects on the global economy. By moving beyond traditional classroom lectures, the activity immersed students in the high-stakes environment of corporate boardrooms and government ministries, requiring them to apply macroeconomic theories to a rapidly evolving geopolitical crisis.

The simulation was structured by dividing the students into various "Stakeholder Boards," each representing a critical sector of the global economy. The participants were tasked with responding to specific, high-pressure scenarios, such as a sudden 20% spike in Brent Crude prices and the potential closure of the Strait of Hormuz, a maritime chokepoint responsible for nearly 20% of the world's oil supply. Students representing the Energy and Petrochemicals sector debated the logistics of tapping into strategic petroleum reserves, while those in the Logistics and Aviation group navigated the challenges of surging jet fuel surcharges and the massive re-routing of global shipping lanes. The activity also highlighted the deep interconnectedness of modern supply chains, particularly regarding FMCG and Agriculture. Students acting as industry leaders analyzed how rising diesel and fertilizer costs directly translate into "input cost inflation," ultimately increasing the price of basic groceries for the end consumer. Meanwhile, the Finance and Central Banking board simulated the difficult policy decisions faced by the RBI and the Federal Reserve, debating whether to raise interest rates to curb war-induced inflation or maintain them to prevent a domestic economic slowdown. A specific focus was placed on the Indian Rupee's vulnerability and the widening trade deficit caused by India's heavy reliance on energy imports.

By the conclusion of the session, the MBA students had gained a profound understanding of the "Safe Haven" effect, observing how financial markets flee to Gold and the US Dollar during times of geopolitical instability. This Role Play Activity successfully transformed complex international news into a practical lesson in Risk Management and Global Business Strategy. By stepping into the shoes of decision-makers, the students moved beyond textbook definitions to appreciate how international politics directly dictates corporate profitability and consumer behaviour.


